Review of the Ban on Internet Sales of Non-prescription Drugs

Outline of the Regulatory Reform

The revised Pharmaceutical Affairs Act was enacted at the extraordinary Diet session which permits Internet sales of virtually all kinds of non-prescription drugs under proper rules to ensure the safety of consumers.

Effects on Economic Growth

- Establishing the Internet as a new infrastructure for economic society will **promote the creation of new** industries and innovation.

Internet sales permitted*

- * With regard to the 23 kinds of drugs immediately after having been switched to non-prescription drugs, Internet sales will be permitted after confirming their safety during the period basically not exceeding three years.
- ** The 5 kinds of dangerous drugs require over-the-counter sales.
